
2020 HOLIDAY GREETING CARD CONTEST WINNER ANNOUNCED

OUTDOOR HOLIDAY LIGHTING SAFETY TIPS

- **#1** When using extension cords, make sure they are rated for outdoor use.
- **#2** Make sure you are using outlets with GFCI protection when decorating outdoors.
- **#3** Don't hang lights using tacks, nails or screws; instead use insulated or plastic hooks.
- **#4** Only use outdoor-rated lights. Strands designated for indoor use cannot withstand the elements.
- **#5** When using ladders to hang lights outdoors, avoid using aluminum ladders and always steer clear of power lines.


