Imagine if you got the news that your son or daughter had cancer. Wouldn't you do everything in your power to help?


That's exactly what Bob and Sue Jones^{*} did when they got the news that their son was diagnosed with stage four cancer. When he lost his job because he was too sick to work, Sue moved to Raleigh to take care of him while Bob stayed in their hometown and continued to help pay the bills.

They did everything they could to juggle doctor and hospital visits, medical bills, their jobs, and the daily demands of life to ensure their son had the care he needed. Like many families that come to our Crisis Center, they reached a point where their bank accounts were depleted.

Because of your support, we were able to help this family with food, rent, and utilities. Sue shopped for groceries at the Client's Choice Market allowing her to stretch the family's limited dollars. Without NRM to help them meet their basic living needs, this young man wouldn't have the consistent care he needed to have a fighting chance at life.

I have worked many years in my nursing career in crisis situations. After retiring 9 years ago, I still felt a need to work with people. This is what brought me to NRM to use my skills to work with those who need our assistance. When I leave at the end of the day, I hope I have made a difference in the lives of the neighbors with whom I met by giving them resources, food, financial assistance, and most importantly emotional support.






