What Promises Will You Believe?

September 5, 2021 – Part 10

2 Peter 1 ³ Everything we could ever need for life and godliness has already been deposited in us by his divine power. For all this was lavished upon us through the rich experience of knowing him who has called us by name and invited us to come to him through a glorious manifestation of his goodness. ⁴ As a result of this, he has given you magnificent promises that are beyond all price, so that through the power of these tremendous promises we can experience partnership with the divine nature, by which you have escaped the corrupt desires that are of the world. TPT

Mark 11 ²⁴ This is the reason I urge you to boldly believe for whatever you ask for in prayer—be convinced that you have received it and it will be yours. TPT

Matthew 7 ⁷ “Ask, and the gift is yours. Seek, and you’ll discover. Knock, and the door will be opened for you. ⁸ For every persistent one will get what he asks for. Every persistent seeker will discover what he longs for. And everyone who knocks persistently will one day find an open door. TPT

Matthew 8 ¹³ Then Jesus turned to the Roman officer and said, “Go home. All that you have believed for will be done for you!” And his son was healed at that very moment. TPT

Hebrews 6 ¹² So don’t allow your hearts to grow dull or lose your enthusiasm, but follow the example of those who fully received what God has promised because of their strong faith and patient endurance. ¹³ Now when God made a promise to Abraham, since there was no one greater than himself, he swore an oath on his own integrity to keep the promise as sure as God exists! ¹⁴ So he said, “Have no doubt, I promise to bless you over and over, and give you a son and multiply you without measure!” ¹⁵ So Abraham waited patiently in faith and succeeded in seeing the promise fulfilled. ¹⁶ It is very common for people to swear an oath by something greater than themselves, for the oath will confirm their statements and end all dispute. ¹⁷ So in the same way, God wanted to end all doubt and confirm it even more forcefully to those who would inherit his promises. His purpose was unchangeable, so God added his vow to the promise. ¹⁸ So it is impossible for God to lie for we know that his promise and his vow will never change! And now we have run into his heart to hide ourselves in his faithfulness. This is where we find his strength and comfort, for he empowers us to seize what has already been established ahead of time—an unshakable hope! TPT

Genesis 12 ¹ Now Yahweh said to Abram: “Leave it all behind – your native land, your people, your father’s household, and go to the land that I will show you. ² Follow me, and I will make you into a great nation. I will exceedingly bless and prosper you, and I will make you famous, so that you will be a tremendous source of blessing for others. ³ I will bless all who bless you and curse all who curse you. And through you all the families of the earth will be blessed.” ⁴ So Abram obeyed Yahweh and left; and Lot went with him. Now Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran after his father died. ⁵ He took his wife Sarai, his nephew Lot, and all the possessions and people he had acquired in Haran; and they departed for the land of Canaan. TPT

Galatians 3 ¹³ Yet, Christ paid the full price to set us free from the curse of the law. He absorbed the curse completely as he became a curse in our place. For it is written: “Everyone who is hung upon a tree is cursed.” ¹⁴ Jesus Christ dissolved the curse from our lives, so that

in him *all the blessings of Abraham* can be poured out upon gentiles. And now through faith we receive the promised Holy Spirit who lives in us. TPT

Romans 4 ³ Listen to what the Scriptures say: Because Abraham believed God's words, his faith transferred God's righteousness into his account. ¹⁷ That's what the Scripture means when it says: "I have made you the father of many nations." He is our example and father, for in God's presence he believed that God can raise the dead and call into being things that don't even exist yet. ¹⁸ Against all odds, when it looked hopeless, Abraham believed the *promise* and expected God to fulfill it. He took God at his word, and as a result he became the father of many nations. God's declaration over him came to pass: "Your descendants will be so many that they will be impossible to count!" ¹⁹ In spite of being nearly one hundred years old when the promise of having a son was made, his faith was so strong that it could not be undermined by the fact that he and Sarah were incapable of conceiving a child. ²⁰⁻²¹ He never stopped believing God's promise, for he was made strong in his faith to father a child. And because he was mighty in faith and convinced that God had all the power needed to fulfill his *promises*, Abraham glorified God! ²² So now you can see why Abraham's faith was credited to his account as righteousness before God. ²³ And this declaration was not just spoken over Abraham, ²⁴ but also over us. For when we believe and embrace the one who brought our Lord Jesus back to life, perfect righteousness will be credited to our account as well. ²⁵ Jesus was handed over to be crucified for the forgiveness of our sins and was raised back to life to prove that he had made us right with God!
