**Psalm 119** <sup>82</sup> I'm consumed with longings for your promises, so I ask, "When will they all come true?" <sup>83</sup> My soul feels dry and shriveled, useless and forgotten, but I will never forget your living truth. TPT

**Romans 8** <sup>28</sup> So we are convinced that every detail of our lives is continually woven together for good, for we are his lovers who have been called to fulfill his designed purpose. TPT

**1 Timothy 2** <sup>3</sup> This is good and pleases God our Savior, <sup>4</sup> who wants everyone to be saved and to understand the truth. NLT

**Jeremiah 32** <sup>17</sup> "O Sovereign LORD! You made the heavens and earth by your strong hand and powerful arm. Nothing is too hard for you!" <sup>27</sup> "I am the LORD, the God of all the peoples of the world. Is anything too hard for me?" NLT

**Acts 9** <sup>33</sup> There he found a man named Aeneas, who had been bedridden for eight years and was paralyzed. <sup>34</sup> Peter said to him, "Aeneas, Jesus Christ heals you. Get up and make your bed." Immediately Aeneas got up. <sup>35</sup> Then all who lived at Lydda and the plain of Sharon saw [what had happened to] him, and they turned to the Lord. AMP - <sup>35</sup> Then the whole population of Lydda and Sharon saw Aeneas walking around, and they turned to the Lord. NLT - <sup>35</sup> All at once he stood to his feet. And when all the people of Lydda and Sharon saw him, they became believers in the Lord. TPT

**Mark 11** <sup>23b</sup> ...and believes that what he says will happen, it will be done. <sup>24</sup> This is the reason I urge you to boldly believe for whatever you ask for in prayer—be convinced that you have received it and it will be yours. TPT

**Luke 18** <sup>1</sup> One day Jesus taught the apostles to keep praying and never stop or lose hope. He shared with them this illustration: TPT

**Galatians 3** <sup>13</sup> Yet, Christ paid the full price to set us free from the curse of the law. He absorbed the curse completely as he became a curse in our place. For it is written: "Everyone who is hung upon a tree is cursed." <sup>14</sup> Jesus Christ dissolved the curse from our lives, so that in him all the blessings of Abraham can be poured out upon gentiles. And now through faith we receive the promised Holy Spirit *who lives in us.* TPT

**Romans 4** <sup>17</sup> That's what the Scripture means when it says: "I have made you the father of many nations." **He is our example and father, for in God's presence he believed that God can raise the dead and call into being things that don't even exist yet.** <sup>18</sup> Against all odds, **when it looked hopeless, Abraham believed the promise and expected God to fulfill it. He took God at his word, and as a result he became the father of many nations. God's declaration over him came to pass: "Your descendants will be so many that they will be impossible to count!"** <sup>20-21</sup> **He never stopped believing God's promise,** for he was made strong in his faith *to father a child*. And because he was mighty in faith and convinced that God had all the power needed to fulfill his promises, **Abraham glorified God!** TPT

**Matthew 7** <sup>7</sup> "Ask, and the gift is yours. Seek, and you'll discover. Knock, and the door will be opened for you. <sup>8</sup> **For every persistent one will get what he asks for. Every persistent seeker will discover what he longs for. And everyone who knocks persistently will one day find an open door.** TPT
