



YOU WERE BORN AGAIN FOR THE GLORY OF GOD

Let God Love You – Immersed in His Glory

April 7, 2024 – Part 1

Psalm 24 ¹⁰ You ask, “Who is this King of Glory?” He is Yahweh, armed and ready for battle, the Mighty One, the invincible commander of heaven’s hosts! Yes, he is the King of Glory! TPT

Glory: *chabod* (kah-vohd); Strong’s #3519: Weightiness; that which is substantial or heavy; glory, honor, splendor, power, wealth, authority, magnificence, fame, dignity, riches, and excellency. The root of *chabod* is *chabad*, “to be heavy, glorious, notable,” or “to be renowned.” In the OT, “heaviness” represented honor and substance, while “lightness” was equated with vanity, instability, temporariness, and emptiness. *Chabod* is God’s glory, not only His honor, renown, and majesty, but also His visible splendor, which filled Solomon’s temple and will someday fill the Earth. From *chabod* are derived the names “Jochebed” (“Yahweh Is Glory”) and Ichabod (“Where Is the Glory?”). *From the Spirit Filled Bible*

Isaiah 60 ¹ Arise, shine; For your light has come! And the glory of the Lord is risen upon you. ² For behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, And deep darkness the people; But the Lord will arise over you, And His glory will be seen upon you. ^{7b} ...They shall ascend with acceptance on My altar, And I will glorify the house of My glory. NKJV

Romans 3 ²³ for we all have sinned and are in need of the glory of God. TPT

Romans 5 ² Our faith guarantees us permanent access into this marvelous kindness that has given us a perfect relationship with God. What incredible joy bursts forth within us as we keep on celebrating our hope of experiencing God’s glory! TPT

John 17 ¹⁰ For all who belong to me now belong to you. And all who belong to you now belong to me as well, and my glory is revealed through their surrendered lives. TPT

Romans 8 ¹⁷ And since we are his true children, we qualify to share all his treasures, for indeed, we are heirs of God himself. And since we are joined to Christ, we also inherit all that he is and all that he has. We will experience being co-glorified with him provided that we accept his sufferings as our own. ¹⁸ I am convinced that any suffering we endure is less than nothing compared to the magnitude of glory that is about to be unveiled within us. ¹⁹ The entire universe is standing on tiptoe, yearning to see the unveiling of God’s *glorious* sons and daughters! TPT

Note: vs 8:18 The Greek word *doxa* can also be translated “radiant beauty,” “splendor,” “perfection.”
Note: vs 8:19 Or “the manifestation of the sons of God.” Interestingly, the Greek word used for “unveiling” (*apokalypsis*) is the same word for the full title of the last book of the Bible, “The Revelation [Unveiling] of Jesus Christ.” The created universe is but the backdrop for the dramatic appearing of God’s sons and daughters unveiled with the glory of Jesus Christ upon them. The verb tense in the Greek text is clear that the “unveiling” is imminent, soon to happen, and destined to take place. Christ’s glory will come to us, enter us, fill us, envelop us, and then be revealed through us as partakers of the glory. Although God will not share His glory with any other, we are no longer “another,” for we are one with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit through faith in Christ.

Exodus 33 ¹⁸ And he said, “Please, show me Your glory.” ¹⁹ Then He said, “I will make all My goodness pass before you, and I will proclaim the name of the Lord before you. I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion.” NKJV

Hebrews 8 ⁶ But now Jesus the Messiah has accepted a priestly ministry which far surpasses theirs, since he is the catalyst of a better covenant which contains far more wonderful promises! TPT

Isaiah 43 ⁴ Since you are *cherished and precious* in my eyes, and because I love you dearly and want to honor you, I willingly give up nations in exchange for you—a man to save your life. TPT

Isaiah 48 ¹¹ I will rescue you for my sake—yes, for my own sake! I will not let my reputation be tarnished, and I will not share my glory with idols! NLT

1 Corinthians 10 ³¹ Whether you eat or drink, live your life in a way that glorifies and honors God. TPT

1 John 4 ^{17b} ...because all that Jesus now is, so are we in this world. TPT

Habakkuk 2 ¹⁴ For as the waters fill the sea, the earth will be filled with an awareness of the glory of the Lord. NLT

Isaiah 6 ¹ In the year that King Uzziah died, I clearly saw the Lord. He was seated on his exalted throne, towering high above me. His long, flowing robe of *splendor* spread throughout the temple. ² Standing above him were the angels of flaming fire, each with six wings: with two wings they covered their faces *in reverence*, with two wings they covered their feet, and with two wings they flew. ³ And one called out to another, saying: “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God, Commander of Angel Armies! The whole earth is filled with his glory!” ⁴ The thunderous voice of the fiery angels caused the foundations of the thresholds to tremble as the cloud of glory filled the temple! TPT

Isaiah 4 ⁵ Then Yahweh will create over all of Mount Zion and over every gathering a cloud of *smoke* by day and a glow of flaming fire by night. And all this manifestation of dazzling glory will spread over them like a wedding canopy. TPT

2 Corinthians 3 ¹⁸ We can all draw close to him with the veil removed from our faces. And with no veil we all become like mirrors who brightly reflect the glory of the Lord Jesus. We are being transfigured into his very image as we move from one brighter level of glory to another. And this glorious transfiguration comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit. TPT

Revelation 4 ¹¹ “You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory, honor, and power, for you created all things, and for your pleasure they were created and exist.” TPT

Matthew 3 ¹³ Then Jesus left Galilee to come to the Jordan to be baptized by John. ¹⁴ But when he waded into the water, John resisted him, saying, “Why are you doing this? I’m the one who needs to be baptized by you, and yet you come to be baptized by me?” ¹⁵ Jesus replied, “It is only right to do all that God requires.” Then John baptized Jesus. ¹⁶ And as Jesus rose up out of the water, the heavenly realm opened up over him and he saw the Holy Spirit descend out of the heavens and rest upon him in the form of a dove. ¹⁷ Then suddenly the voice of the Father shouted from the sky, saying, “This is my Son—the Beloved! My greatest delight is in him.” TPT
