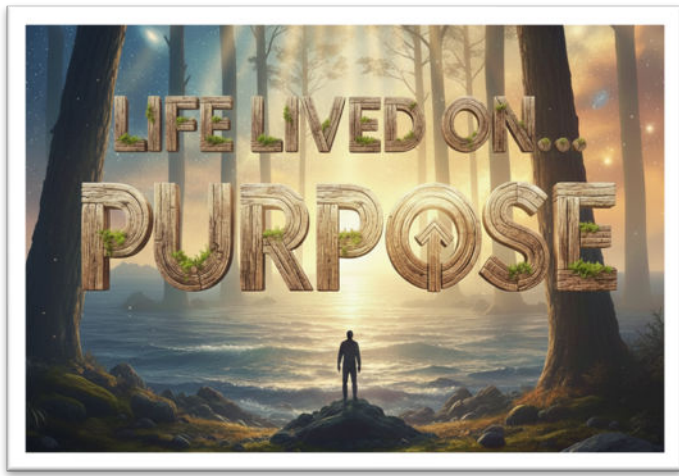




Ps 65 ¹¹ You crown the year with Your GOODNESS and Your paths drip with ABUNDANCE! NKJ

Col 1 ¹⁵⁻¹⁶ We look at Jesus and see God's ORIGINAL PURPOSE in everything created... both in the heavenly realm and on the earth, all that is seen and all that is unseen. Every seat of power, realm of government, principality, and authority — it all exists for HIS PURPOSES!

¹⁷ He existed before anything was made, and now everything finds its PURPOSE in him. TPT/VC/MSG

From the moment God formed humanity, He embedded within us a divine longing - to know why we are here and what our lives are meant to accomplish. Purpose is not a side issue of faith; it is the very heartbeat of it. When a person awakens to God's purpose for their life, something ignites on the inside. Faith becomes alive, hope becomes resilient, and life itself begins to feel charged with meaning. Purpose transforms existence from survival into significance. Without purpose, days blur together, success feels hollow, and even blessings can feel strangely empty. But with purpose, even the simplest moments are infused with weight and wonder. Purpose turns work into worship, challenges into training, and setbacks into stepping stones. It gives direction to our energy and clarity to our decisions.

A LIFE OF PURPOSE is not merely busy — it is INTENTIONAL.

2 Timothy 1 ⁹ God... called us with a holy calling that leads to A LIFE OF PURPOSE! AMP/TPT

PURPOSES WE ALL SHARE ARE THE GREAT COMMANDMENT, THE GREAT COMMISSION AND SEEKING FIRST THE KINGDOM OF GOD!

PURSUING PURPOSE RELEASES SUPERNATURAL WONDERS AND REWARDS!

Philippians 4 ¹³ I can do everything God CALLED ME to do through Christ who gives me STRENGTH and POWER to FULFILL HIS PURPOSE! AMP/TLB

Romans 12 ⁴⁻⁵ In the same way that one body has many different parts with different functions... We become together what we could not be alone. ⁶ Since our gifts differ according to the grace on each of us, it is important that we USE THE GIFTS we've been given. If prophecy is your gift, prophecy according to your proportion of faith. ⁷ If practical service is your gift, then serve well. If teaching is your gift, then teach well. ⁸ If you have been given a voice of encouragement, then use it often. If giving is your gift, then be generous. If leading, then be eager to get started. If sharing acts of mercy, then be cheerful and joyful in sharing VC/AMP

1 Peter 4 ¹⁰ Each of you has received a gift to USE to serve others. Be good servants and stewards of God's various gifts of grace. EXB

One of the most thrilling aspects of living with purpose is the realization that God delights in involving us in His work. The Creator of the universe chooses to partner with ordinary people to accomplish extraordinary things. He invites us to carry His love, release His compassion, and reflect His character into the world. This partnership elevates every season of life. No matter where we are — at home, in business, in ministry, or in quiet obedience — our lives can echo with eternal impact. There is a profound fulfillment that comes from alignment. When your gifts, passions, and faith begin to work together, something sacred happens. You experience the joy of being fully alive. This fulfillment is not dependent on ease or comfort; it thrives even in adversity. In fact, purpose often shines brightest in hardship. Trials can refine us, stretch us, and deepen our reliance on God. They do not disqualify us — they prepare us.

Purpose reminds us that pain is not wasted, delays are not denials, and seasons of waiting are often seasons of formation. Hope is sustained when we trust that GOD IS WORKING, even when we cannot yet see the outcome. Purpose keeps us moving forward.

Rom 8 ²⁸ We know with great confidence that God causes ALL THINGS and every detail to work together for good for those who love God and are called to FULFILL His PLAN and PURPOSE TPT/AMP

PURPOSE GIVES MEANING, EVEN TO PAIN. NOTHING IS WASTED IN GOD'S HANDS

One of the most beautiful aspects of purpose is that it redeems the past. God wastes nothing. Failures, detours, and broken seasons can become testimonies of grace. Purpose reframes our story. What once seemed like weakness becomes a source of strength. What once caused pain becomes a channel of healing for others. In God's hands, every chapter has meaning.

Philippians 3 ¹² I'm not there yet, nor have I become perfect, but I run with passion... so that I may reach His PURPOSE, and nothing will stand in my way! ¹³ I am... putting everything on the line... ¹⁴ I am sprinting toward the ONLY GOAL THAT COUNTS: the heavenly goal!

¹⁵ So let all who are fully mature have this same passion! ... ¹⁷ Imitate me...! TPT/VC

Acts 20 ²⁴ Whether I live or die is not important because I don't cling to my life for my own sake. The value I place on my life is to FULFILL MY PURPOSE - to finish the race Jesus assigned to me - to preach the good news of God's grace. TPT/VC/CSB

PURPOSE IS NOT COMFORT-DRIVEN, BUT MISSION-DRIVEN

A purposeful life is not always easy, but it is always meaningful. There is a difference between a comfortable life and a fulfilled one. Comfort seeks convenience; purpose seeks obedience. Comfort avoids risk; purpose embraces faith. Those who live for purpose understand that sacrifice is not loss — it is investment. Every act of faith, every step of obedience, every moment of perseverance carries eternal weight. Purpose connects us to something far bigger than ourselves. It lifts our eyes beyond personal success and draws our hearts toward impact. When we live with purpose, we begin to see people differently. We become more generous, more patient, more compassionate. We realize that our lives are not isolated stories but interconnected threads in God's unfolding plan. What we do today can shape generations tomorrow. When we live intentionally, our faith gains boldness. We begin to pray differently, serve differently, and dream differently. We stop asking only for personal comfort and start asking how we can make a difference. Purpose awakens courage. It empowers us to stand firm, speak truth, and walk faithfully — even when it costs us something. To live with purpose is to experience joy that circumstances cannot steal and fulfillment that success alone cannot provide. Purpose infuses life with excitement, grounds it with meaning, and fills it with hope. There is no greater joy than living each day aware that what you do, who you love, and how you obey truly matters - now and forever.

Jer 29 ⁵⁻⁶ Build houses, plant gardens, get married and have children. Encourage your sons and daughters to get married and raise families. Flourish...you must increase and not decrease!

⁷ Work for the good of the city... and PRAY to God, asking for a blessing on your city... ¹⁰⁻¹¹ I will...fulfill my promise of giving you good things...I know the marvelous destiny I have in store for you, a FUTURE PLANNED OUT IN DETAIL... to surround you with peace and prosperity and give you a beautiful future, glistening with hope... ¹⁴ All that you have lost, I will restore TPT

Proverbs 19 ²¹ A person may plan all kinds of things for his life, but only God's PURPOSE will SUCCEED in the end. TPT/GNT

SUCCESS IS FINDING OUT WHAT GOD WANTS YOU TO DO AND DOING IT

1 Corinthians 9 ²⁴ When there's a race, ALL the runners bolt to the FINISH LINE, but only one will take the prize. When YOU run, run for THE PRIZE! ²⁵ Athletes in training are very strict with themselves, and for what? For a wreath that soon withers or is crushed or simply forgotten. That is not our race. We run for the crown that we will WEAR FOR ETERNITY.

²⁶ So I do not run AIMLESSLY. I do not let my eyes drift off the FINISH LINE. VC

PURPOSE ELIMINATES AIMLESSNESS THROUGH PASSIONATE FOCUS

In a world overflowing with distractions, opinions, and competing values, purpose acts like a compass. It helps us say yes to the right things and no to the unnecessary ones. When you know why you are called, you are less tempted to chase applause, comparison, or cultural pressure. Purpose anchors the soul. It steadies the heart. It guards against burnout because it reminds us that we are not striving for validation — we are responding to a calling.

John 15 ¹⁶ You did not choose me, I chose you! And I have commissioned you to go PURPOSEFULLY and bear fruit that will last, so that WHATEVER YOU ASK from the Father in my name he may give you. AMP/CJB

PURPOSE IS ABOUT LASTING FRUIT, NOT TEMPORARY SUCCESS

Ecclesiastes 3 ¹ For everything that happens in life —there is a season, a right time for everything under heaven... ⁹ What good comes to anyone who works so hard, ALL to gain a few possessions? ... ¹¹ Everything is appropriate in its own time... But God has also placed in our minds and hearts a sense of eternity... ¹⁴⁻¹⁵ Everything God does endures for all time... and God holds accountable all the pursuits of humanity. VC/TLB

A life of purpose prepares us for eternity. It reminds us that this life is not the end of the story. Our choices ripple beyond the present moment. When we live with eternal perspective, priorities shift. Love becomes central. Faith becomes active. Legacy becomes intentional. We begin to live not just for today, but for what will last forever.

2 Cor 5 ⁹ We make it our LIFE'S PASSION to live pleasing to him. ¹⁰ For believers will be called to account and appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may be rewarded for our ACTIONS IN LIFE, whether good or worthless. Each will be held responsible for his... PURPOSES, goals, motives — the use or misuse of his time, opportunities and abilities. TPT/PH/AMP

Living a life of purpose NEVER ENDS WITH YOU! One powerful aspect of purpose is its generational reach. What God builds in one generation becomes the foundation for the next. When you choose to live intentionally, faithfully, and obediently, you are not only shaping your own story — you are quietly shaping the future of your family.

Purpose builds spiritual inheritance. Children and grandchildren do not learn purpose primarily from words, but from witness. They observe how you respond to pressure, how you prioritize faith, how you treat people, and how you steward what God entrusted to you. Your life becomes a living sermon, teaching future generations what it looks like to trust God fully and live boldly. Generational impact is often invisible in the moment but undeniable over time. When a parent or grandparent chooses purpose over convenience, integrity over compromise, and faith over fear, it sets a spiritual trajectory. Patterns are formed. Values are normalized. Faith becomes less abstract and more tangible. Purpose gives future generations reason to believe that obedience is possible and that a life surrendered to God is not restrictive — it is rich. Living with purpose also breaks unhealthy cycles. Where fear, scarcity, or passivity once ruled, purpose introduces faith, vision, and courage. Your obedience can close doors that have been open for generations and open new ones your family has never walked through before.

Purpose becomes a bridge — carrying your family from what was into what God always intended. And long after your voice is silent, the echo of your purpose will still be speaking, calling your family forward into God's future with faith, clarity, and hope.
