Psalm 127 ³ Children are God's love-gift; they are heaven's generous reward. ⁴ Children born to a young couple will one day rise to protect and provide for their parents. ⁵ Happy will be the couple who has many of them! A household full of children will not bring shame on your name but victory when you face your enemies, for your offspring will have influence and honor to prevail on your behalf! TPT

Proverbs 22 ⁶ Dedicate your children to God and point them in the way that they should go, and the values they've learned from you will be with them for life. TPT

1 Samuel 1 ²⁷ For this boy I prayed, and the LORD has given me my petition which I asked of Him. ²⁸ So I have also dedicated him to the LORD; as long as he lives he is dedicated to the LORD. And he worshiped the LORD there. NASB

Acts 2 ³⁸ Peter replied, "Repent and return to God, and each one of you must be baptized in the name of Jesus, the Anointed One, to have your sins removed. Then you may take hold of the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ For God's promise of the Holy Spirit is for you and your families, for those yet to be born and for everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself." TPT

Isaiah 49 ²⁵ But Yahweh says: "The prey will be freed from the mighty warrior and captives will be rescued from a conqueror! For I will fight with those who fight with you, and I myself will save your children." TPT

Isaiah 54 ¹⁰ Even if the mountains were to crumble and the hills disappear, my heart of steadfast, faithful love will never leave you, and my covenant of peace with you will never be shaken," says Yahweh, whose love and compassion will never give up on you. ¹¹ "You unhappy one, storm-tossed and troubled, I am ready to rebuild you with precious stones and embed your foundation with sapphires. ¹³ All your children will be taught by Yahweh, and great will be their peace and prosperity. ¹⁴ You will be established in righteousness. Oppression—be far from them! Fear—be far from them! Yes, terror will not come near you, nor will you be afraid. ¹⁵ If anyone dares to stir up strife against you, it is not from me! Those who challenge you will go down in defeat. ¹⁷ But I promise you, no weapon meant to hurt you will succeed, and you will refute every accusing word spoken against you. This promise is the inheritance of Yahweh's servants, and their vindication is from me," says Yahweh. TPT

Psalm 91 ² I will say of the LORD, "He is my refuge and my fortress; My God, in Him I will trust." ⁹ Because you have made the LORD, who is my refuge, Even the Most High, your dwelling place, ¹⁰ No evil shall befall you, Nor shall any plague come near your dwelling; ¹¹ For He shall give His angels charge over you, To keep you in all your ways. ¹⁴ "Because he has set his love upon Me, therefore I will deliver him; I will set him on high, because he has known My name. ¹⁵ He shall call upon Me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble; I will deliver him and honor him. ¹⁶ With long life I will satisfy him, And show him My salvation." NKJV

Psalm 121 ¹⁻² I look up to the mountains and hills, longing for God's help. But then I realize that our true help and protection is only from the Lord, our Creator who made the heavens and the earth. ³ He will guard and guide me, never letting me stumble or fall. God is my keeper; he will never forget

nor ignore me. ⁴ He will never slumber nor sleep; he is the Guardian-God for his people, Israel.
⁵ Yahweh himself will watch over you; he's always at your side to shelter you safely in his presence.
⁶ **He's protecting you from all danger both day and night.** ⁷ **He will keep you from every form of evil or calamity as he continuously watches over you.** ⁸ You will be guarded by God himself. You will be safe when you leave your home, and safely you will return. **He will protect you now, and he'll protect you forevermore!** TPT

Deuteronomy 30 ¹⁹ I call heaven and earth as witnesses today against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing; **therefore choose life, that both you and your descendants may live;** NKJV

Mark 10 ¹³ **The parents kept bringing their little children to Jesus so that he would lay his hands on them and bless them.** But the disciples kept rebuking and scolding the people for doing it. ¹⁴ When Jesus saw what was happening, he became indignant with his disciples and said to them, "Let all the little children come to me and never hinder them! Don't you know that God's kingdom exists for such as these?" ¹⁵ Listen to the truth I speak: Whoever does not open their arms to receive God's kingdom like a teachable child will never enter it." ¹⁶ **Then he embraced each child, and laying his hands on them, he lovingly blessed each one.** TPT

Psalms 112 ¹ Shout in celebration of praise to the Lord! Everyone who loves the Lord and delights in him will cherish his words and be blessed beyond expectation. ² **Their descendants will be prosperous and influential. Every generation of the righteous will experience his favor.** ³ **Great blessing and wealth fills the house of the wise, for their integrity endures forever.** ⁴ Even if darkness overtakes them, sunrise-brilliance will come bursting through because they are gracious to others, so tender and true. ⁵ Life is good for the one who is generous and charitable, conducting affairs with honesty and truth. ⁶ Their circumstances will never shake them and others will never forget their example. ⁷ They will not live in fear or dread of what may come, for their hearts are firm, ever secure in their faith. ⁸ Steady and strong, they will not be afraid, but will calmly face their every foe until they all go down in defeat. ⁹ Never stingy and always generous to those in need, **they lived lives of influence and honor that will never be forgotten, for they were full of good deeds.** TPT

Proverbs 10 ¹⁵ **A rich man's wealth becomes like a citadel of strength, but the poverty of the poor leaves their security in shambles.** - ²² **True enrichment comes from the blessing of the Lord, with rest and contentment in knowing that it all comes from him.** TPT

Deuteronomy 8 ¹⁸ **But you are to remember the Lord your God, for it is He who is giving you power to make wealth, in order to confirm His covenant which He swore to your fathers, as it is this day.** NASB

Isaiah 48 ¹⁷ This is what Yahweh, your Kinsman-Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel says: "I am Yahweh, your God. **I am the One who teaches you how to succeed** and who leads you *step by step* in the way you should go. TPT

Genesis 12 ² **Follow me, and I will make you into a great nation. I will exceedingly bless and prosper you, and I will make you famous, so that you will be a tremendous source of blessing for others.** ³ **I will bless all who bless you and curse all who curse you. And through you all the families of the earth will be blessed.** ⁴ So Abram obeyed Yahweh and left; and Lot went with him. Now **Abram was seventy-five years old** when he departed from Haran *after his father died*. ... ^{13:2} **Now Abram had become very rich in livestock, silver, and gold.** ... ^{15:1} Afterwards, the word of Yahweh came to Abram in a vision and said, "Abram, don't yield to fear, for I am your Faithful Shield and your Abundant Reward." ² But Abram replied, **"Lord Yahweh, what good is your reward if I remain childless? I'm about to die without a son,** and my servant, Eliezer of Damascus,

will inherit all my wealth. ³ A servant in my household will end up with everything because you have not given me any children.” ⁴ Immediately, the word of Yahweh came to him: “No! Eliezer will not be your heir. I will give you a son from your own body to be your heir.” ⁵ Then Yahweh brought him outside his tent and said, “Gaze into the night sky. Go ahead and try to count the stars.” He continued, “Your seed will be as numerous as the stars!” ⁶ **And Abram trusted every word Yahweh had spoken! And because of his faith, Yahweh credited it to him as righteousness.** ... ^{26:1} Now, another famine struck the land, like the one in Abraham’s time. Isaac traveled to Gerar where Abimelech was the Philistine king. ² Yahweh appeared before Isaac and said, “Do not go down to Egypt. Stay in the land that I will reveal to you. ³ Live there as a foreigner, and **my presence will be with you. I promise to bless you, for I will give all these lands to you and your descendants. I will fulfill the oath I swore to your father Abraham.** ⁴ I will make your descendants as numerous as the stars of heaven, and I will *one day* give them all these lands. I will bless all the nations of the earth through your offspring ⁵ **because Abraham was faithful to me.** He listened to my voice and yielded his heart to follow my direction. He kept my commandments, my instructions, and my teachings.” ... ¹² **Isaac planted crops in that land, and in the same year reaped a hundred-fold harvest, for Yahweh greatly blessed him!** ¹³ Isaac grew richer and richer until he was extremely wealthy. ¹⁴ He acquired so many flocks and herds and so many servants that the Philistines grew jealous, TPT

1 Timothy 6 ¹⁰ **Loving money is a root of all evils.** Some people run after it so much that they have given up their faith. Craving more money pushes them away from the faith into error, compounding misery in their lives! TPT

Luke 15 ¹¹ Then Jesus said, “Once there was a father with two sons. ¹² The younger son came to his father and said, ‘Father, don’t you think it’s time to give me my share of your estate?’ So the father went ahead and distributed between the two sons their inheritance. ¹³ Shortly afterward, the younger son packed up all his belongings and traveled off to see the world. He journeyed to a far-off land where he soon wasted all he was given in a binge of extravagant and reckless living. ¹⁴ “With everything spent and nothing left, he grew hungry, because there was a severe famine in that land. ¹⁵ So he begged a farmer in that country to hire him. The farmer hired him and sent him out to feed the pigs. ¹⁶ The son was so famished, he was willing even to eat the slop given to the pigs, because no one would feed him a thing. ¹⁷ **‘Humiliated, the son finally realized what he was doing, and he thought, ‘There are many workers at my father’s house who have all the food they want with plenty to spare. They lack nothing. Why am I here dying of hunger, feeding these pigs and eating their slop?’** ¹⁸ I want to go back home to my father’s house, and I’ll say to him, “Father, I was wrong. I have sinned against you. ¹⁹ I’ll never again be worthy to be called your son. Please, Father, just treat me like one of your employees.” ’ ²⁰ “So the young son set off for home. **From a long distance away, his father saw him coming, dressed as a beggar, and great compassion swelled up in his heart for his son who was returning home. The father raced out to meet him, swept him up in his arms, hugged him dearly, and kissed him over and over with tender love.** ²¹ “Then the son said, ‘Father, I was wrong. I have sinned against you. I could never deserve to be called your son. Just let me be—’ **‘The father interrupted and said, ‘Son, you’re home now!’** ²² “Turning to his servants, the father said, **‘Quick, bring me the best robe, my very own robe, and I will place it on his shoulders. Bring the ring, the seal of sonship, and I will put it on his finger. And bring out the best shoes you can find for my son.’** ²³ **Let’s prepare a great feast and celebrate.** ²⁴ **For my beloved son was once dead, but now he’s alive! Once he was lost, but now he is found! And everyone celebrated with overflowing joy.** TPT
